Weekly trash pick-up is provided on Wednesdays. The weeks containing the following holidays will move your pick-up day to Thursday: Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day & Christmas. Brush will be 2nd and 4th Tuesdays in the Spring and Summer. Leaf Pick Up will be Tuesdays and Wednesdays in the Fall.

ADOPT A HYDRANT

There are approximately 130 fire hydrants located in the Village of Pinckney. By adopting a hydrant and keeping it clear of snow in the winter, you will save firefighters precious seconds needed to save a victim's life or fight a spreading fire. Help yourself and your neighbors by locating and 'adopting' your nearest hydrants and maintaining open access. If you believe there is an issue with a hydrant needing repair or attention, please contact the Village of Pinckney DPW at 734-878-0666.

Winter Maintenance - Mailboxes

Please check your mailbox posts to ensure that they are solid and sturdy in the ground. This will ensure that when heavy snow is plowed off the road, your mailbox will not be pushed over.

After a snowfall, remember to clear a three-foot radius around fire hydrants near your home.

Snow on Sidewalks –

Per ordinance 92.62, snow or ice may NOT remain on the sidewalks more than 24 hours (business) or 48 hours (residential) after it has fallen or accumulated. If you don't shovel your sidewalks, you WILL be fined and the snow removed at the EXPENSE OF THE PROPERTY OWNER.

Snow Emergency Parking Rules –

In the event of a large snowfall (four inches or more), the Village of Pinckney will declare a snow emergency. No vehicles will be allowed to park on the street in order to allow DPW to safely plow the streets. Snow emergencies are declared on the Pinckney PD Facebook, on WHMI, and the Livingston Daily. **If a large snowfall is forecast, please do not park on the street.**



Help Others Shovel Snow

People who are elderly or people with disabilities may need assistance with meeting their obligation as property owners to remove snow from their sidewalks. The Village office encourages residents to be aware of neighbors who may need help with snow removal. Reach out and provide a helping hand. You will benefit your neighbor, pedestrians who use the sidewalk, and yourself as you give service.

Snow Shoveling How-To

Dress appropriately.



Use a sturdy shovel.



Bend knees to lift snow. Use legs, shoulders and torso. Do not use your back.



Remember to rest when needed and hydrate.
