President Buerman called the meeting to order in Village Council Chambers at 220 S. Howell, Pinckney, at 7:00 p.m. on May 11, 2026.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Conquest, Coppersmith, Kane, Self, Wagner and President Buerman
Also Present: Garrison (Police Chief), Moma (DPW Director), McCall (Village Clerk), Jim Jensen (Putnam Twp Trustee and Putnam Liaison to the Village), and approximately 14 members of public, including entire DPW staff.
Absent: Bierman

OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT at 7:01pm. Ray Rau spoke against the proposed bereavement/sick policy. Michael Hughes spoke in favor of tabling the resolutions regarding vacation/PTO time until a better solution is available. Linda Lavey read a statement against all of the proposed resolutions regarding PTO and Salaried workers, understanding that budget must be balanced, but not on the backs of our employees. Don Bedwell spoke in support of tabling the proposed PTO policy and to reconsider the effects of the resolutions on long time employees. Public comment closed at 7:12pm.

ADD ITEM TO AGENDA: President Buerman suggested adding an appointment to DDA vacancy as #2 on the agenda. Motion to approve by Kane, second by Wagner. Motion passes in a unanimous roll call vote.

CONSENT AGENDA: Motion to approve by Coppersmith, Second by Self. Motion passes in a unanimous roll call vote.

PRESIDENT'S/VILLAGE MANAGER/ZONING ADMINISTRATOR REPORT:

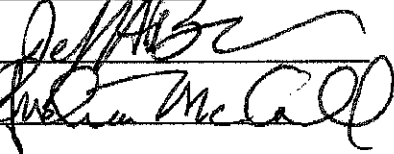

With no further comments or concerns, meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.

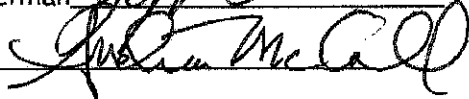

A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A PERSONAL TIME OFF (PTO) POLICY FOR ALL VILLAGE EMPLOYEES IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE MICHIGAN EARNED SICK TIME ACT (ESTA)

WHEREAS, the Village of Pinckney seeks to maintain clear, consistent, and equitable employment policies; and

WHEREAS, the current structure of employee leave policies lacks uniformity and creates administrative inconsistencies; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires to establish a standardized Personal Time Off (PTO) policy applicable to Village employees; and

WHEREAS, the Village recognizes the importance of complying with the Michigan Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA) and applicable federal laws;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Pinckney adopts the following Personal Time Off (PTO) policy:

1. Eligibility

Personal Time Off (PTO) shall be available to all Village employees, including both full-time and part-time staff, **excluding employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement (CBA), including Police Union employees, whose benefits shall be governed by the terms of their respective union contract. In the event of any conflict between this policy and a collective bargaining agreement, the collective bargaining agreement shall control.**

2. PTO Allocation

- Full-time employees shall receive one hundred twenty (120) hours of PTO annually.
 - PTO shall be front-loaded and made available to employees beginning on their date of hire and at the start of each subsequent benefit year.
 - Part-time employees shall receive PTO in an amount that ensures compliance with the Michigan Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA), as administered by the Village.

3. Use of PTO

PTO under this policy shall satisfy the requirements of the Michigan Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA) and may be used for the following purposes:

- The employee’s own mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition, including medical diagnosis, care, treatment, or preventative care.
- The care of a family member with a mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition, including medical diagnosis, care, treatment, or preventative care
- Absences related to domestic violence or sexual assault affecting the employee or a family member, including medical care, counseling, legal services, or relocation.
- Closure of the employee’s primary workplace by order of a public official due to a public health emergency
- Care of a child whose school or place of care has been closed by order of a public official due to a public health emergency.
- Exposure to a communicable disease where the presence of the employee or a family member would jeopardize the health of others.
- Attendance at meetings at a child’s school or place of care related to the child’s health or disability

PTO shall be administered in accordance with applicable Michigan law and Village administrative procedures.

4. Non-Rollover Policy

PTO shall operate under a “use it or lose it” structure. Any unused PTO shall not roll over into the following year, consistent with front-loading provisions under Michigan law.

5. Compliance with Law

This policy is intended to comply with the Michigan Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA) and all applicable state and federal laws.

Salaried employees classified as exempt under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall be presumed to work forty (40) hours per week for purposes of compliance, unless their normal workweek is less.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk and/or designated administrative staff are authorized to implement and administer this policy and update internal systems accordingly.

AGENDA APPROVAL: Coppersmith made motion to approve agenda, Second by Kane, passes in a unanimous roll call vote.

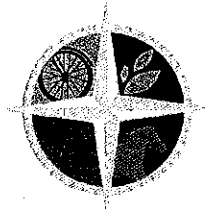

OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT at 7:01pm. With no one wishing to speak, public comment closed at 7:01pm.

ADD ITEM TO AGENDA: President Buerman suggested adding a resolution to lower payment to employees who do not take village health insurance.

- Treasurer Dolan and Accountant Haines gave a full report on the draft budget

PUBLIC HEARING: FISCAL YEAR 2026-2027 BUDGET

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Julie Amy was happy with the DPW budget but had questions about the Police Budget and mentioned recent Facebook posts by the Chief regarding Monthly Activity Logs. Linda VanBlaircum is thankful for police patrolling the neighborhoods. Linda Lavey has questions about the current draft budget and read a letter to council. Linda Seger believes we need to protect emergency services for the village and suggests a closer look at our budget, such as efficiency audits. Martina Fenech would like clarification on what each council member stands for. Greg Stine asks why we are spending so much money on Police for such a small area. Public commenting closed at 7:23.

SWEARING IN OF PLANNING COMMISSIONER ADAM SCHINGECK: Motion to appoint Adam Schingeck to Planning Commission by Bierman, second by Coppersmith, motion carries in a unanimous roll call vote. Commissioner Schingeck was officially sworn in by Clerk McCall.

DISCUSSION: OVERVIEW OF BUDGET. Many aspects of the draft budget were discussed at length, as well as possible strategies to trim it further. Official budget adoption will take place on June 8.

2026 L-4027 MILLAGE REQUEST TO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS: Motion to approve by Coppersmith, second by Wagner. Motion passes in a unanimous roll call vote.

RESOLUTION TO CUT THE "IN LIEU OF INSURANCE" INCENTIVE IN HALF for employees who do not take the village insurance. Motion to accept by Bierman, second by Self. Motion passes in a unanimous roll call vote.

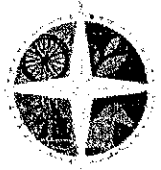
PUBLIC FORUM opened at 8:30 p.m. Julie Amy went over police activity statistics from February 2026 and questioned cost vs. benefits as well as recent Police raises, feeling that they were misrepresented at the time. Matt Stuck Spoke of a neighbor's blighted and abandoned property and asked the village to do something. Linda VanBlaircum complimented the Village DPW on the care of the cemetery. Valerie MacDonald had questions about the vacant land behind the village hall off of Portage Street. Greg Stine asked if DPW has a woodchipper and if they could provide wood chips as mulch for the community garden. Mike Szafranski mentioned that understands the difficult financial decisions, as his own company recently discontinued health care altogether. Public forum closed at 8:44 p.m.

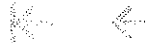

WHEREAS, the Village Council recognizes the additional responsibilities associated with this role and therefore provides for a stipend in compensation for such duties.

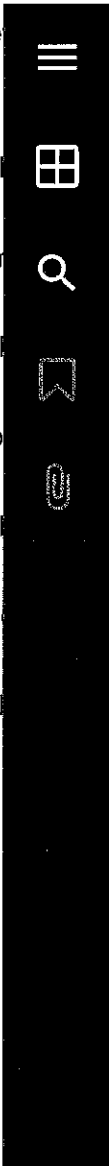

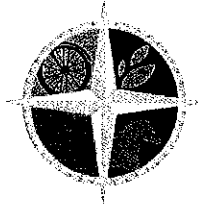

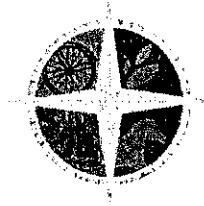
