August Update

Toxic Chemical Discharged to the Wixom Wastewater Treatment Plant Found to be Below Levels of Concern in the Huron River.

It is with great relief that most of the hexavalent chromium solution that Tribar Technologies released into Wixom's Wastewater Treatment Plant two weeks ago did not reach the Huron River. Michigan's EGLE and DHHS, the City of Ann Arbor, Wixom and others made significant efforts to determine the timing, amount, and fate of the toxic chemical that was released between July 29 -31. Most of the hexavalent chromium was captured and retained at the wastewater treatment plant.

As a result, on August 12, the "no contact" advisory for the portion of the Huron River system between Wixom and Kent Lake was lifted. Monitoring the river sediments and water column will continue for several weeks to ensure the safety of the river and Ann Arbor's drinking water, which is sourced from the Huron River. While we are incredibly fortunate to have avoided what could have been a horrific ecological and human health disaster, we cannot lose sight of what ALMOST happened.

We will advocate for accountability by Tribar Technologies, consider legal action with partners, push for stronger cleanup laws and demand that industry stop using hexavalent chromium. We will continue to serve as a trusted source of information during a crisis to help our community stay safe.
