The Village of Pinckney is 1.3 square miles. Within that 1.3 square miles, there are 11 miles of local streets.

### The Process of Plowing Our Streets

With the start of winter, the DPW would like to inform residents of how we go about removing snow from our streets. Whether it's an inch of snow or a foot of snow that falls, major streets, "high traffic roads," are always the first to be plowed and salted. Once these streets are opened up, we move to our secondary streets. These are higher-density interior streets throughout town, like subdivisions and connecting streets. Last, the dead-end streets that branch off secondary streets wrap up the process. The crews are also responsible for clearing snow & ice from all municipal parking areas.

Something else to keep in mind when you are out shoveling your driveways is that depending on the amount of snow we get, plow trucks may have to make several passes on streets in order to get them fully open to traffic. This means that if the snow isn't tight up against the curb or edge of road, it is likely the plow truck will be back through and snow will be pushed back into your driveway, resulting in it needing to be shoveled again. Just a friendly heads-up. Trying to save residents from shoveling twice.

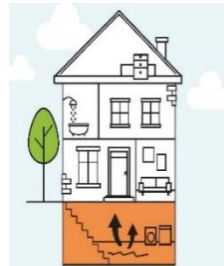
### Protect your family from Radon

Test kits have been ordered and will be available in January at Village Hall. There is no cost involved. For more information, you can contact Livingston County Health Department at 517-546-9858.

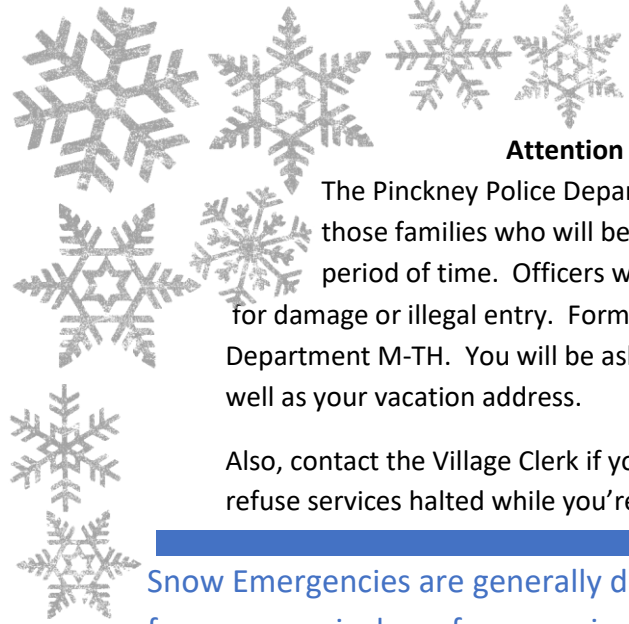


**Village Hall will be closed**

**Attention Snowbirds:**

The Pinckney Police Department offers security checks for those families who will be out of town for an extended period of time. Officers will walk around the home to check for damage or illegal entry. Forms are available at the Police Department M-TH. You will be asked for an emergency contact as well as your vacation address.



Also, contact the Village Clerk if you wish to have your refuse services halted while you're away.



Snow Emergencies are generally declared when four or more inches of snow or ice accumulate. No vehicle is to be parked on any street so that crews can safely plow. Announcements are made on the Pinckney PD Facebook, WHMI Radio and Livingston Daily Newspaper.

Don't forget – It is the property owner's responsibility to clear snow and ice from any sidewalk abutting their property within 24 hours of a snow event. If accumulation is over 4", that time is extended to 48 hours. A fine could be incurred if you fail to do so. Let's keep everyone safe!

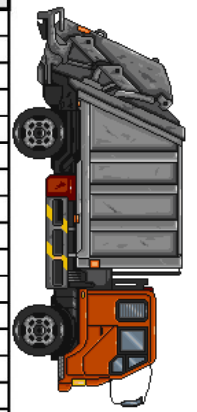
