

Re: Zoning Administrator's Report

Permits & Code Enforcement: Please note the following since my last report:

2 Land Use Permits were issued – fence & generator

- * 35 Waivers were issued most were for re-roof due to the hail storm we experienced
- * 3 ROW Permits issued Driveways

Planning Commission:

- BTC 475 Pinckney, LLC (Kril) Request for Conditional Rezoning: Per the request by Village Council to begin the process to revert 450 N. Howell back to the original R4 zoning district based on non-compliance of the 2018 conditional rezoning agreement, the Commission scheduled and held a public hearing on October 2nd. At the same time, Mr. Kril of BTC 475 Pinckney, made application for the SBD zoning and new agreement to continue with his plans for an indoor/outdoor recreation facility. The Commission has recommended to the Village Council they enter into an agreement with BTC 475 Pinckney, LLC for the conditional rezoning from R4 to SBD with Mr. Kril's voluntary conditions. Depending upon Council action, Mr. Kril will need to go through the special land use and site plan process again.
- Final Site Plan Review Lakeland Knoll Project Update: On 8/30/23, we received a revised site plan submittal from the applicant taking into account the waiver of Technical Standards as approved by Council. Although the Village Engineer has moved some of his comments to be addressed during the construction plan review, there are still significant issues that need to be addressed and revised plans submitted. A meeting is scheduled for Monday, October 9th with Mr. Blau, village staff and consultants to review these outstanding issues. The Commission received an update at their last meeting and tabled consideration until their November meeting.
- An application has been submitted for Special Land Use Permit to operate a child care facility in the People's Congregational Church at 125 E. Unadilla. A public hearing will be held on November 6, 2023.

DDA:

- At their October 2nd meeting, the DDA authorized the expenditure of \$675 for the Spooktacular event scheduled for October 28th per the request of the sponsor, M36 Rotary.
- Again this year, the DDA Board has contracted with Santa's Light Crew for installation of the
 holiday garland & lights. Last year we purchased and installed material to decorate 60 light poles
 along the streets within the DDA. This year, the Board authorized an additional 20 poles to
 expand what we started last season.
- The DDA Fall/Winter Newsletter was sent out by both email and through the post office to business and property owners within the DDA on October 5th (attached).

Other Business:

- Updated website information: Recently, we have made some changes to the village website:
 - * Site Plan Review: On the zoning page, a lot of information has been added to assist potential developers find the necessary information and understand the process for site plan, special land use and other planning functions as well as provide flowcharts, links to pertinent sections of the Zoning Ordinance, links to specific applications, etc. https://villageofpinckney.org/zoningplanning/
 - * Boards and Commissions: A new page has been added to provide an overview of the duties, expectations, etc. of board and commission members for not only potential applicants, but also serves as training, and refresher for current members by providing handbooks, fact sheets, current bylaws, goals, plans and other resources and reference material. https://villageofpinckney.org/get-involved/


