All people in Southeast Michigan benefit from a connected, thriving region of small towns, dynamic urban centers, active waterfronts, diverse neighborhoods, premier educational institutions, and abundant agricultural, recreational, and natural areas.



SEMCOG staff provide direct services to member communities, including:

- One-on-one technical assistance for local challenges and current planning opportunities;
- Guidance on integrating regional plans and policies to maximize local outcomes; and
- Assistance with funding and resource opportunities.

The direct services provided by staff evolve to align with local and regional projects and priorities. Areas of emphasis for assistance currently include:

- **Economic Development** corridor revitalization, quality places, talent, workforce development;
- Broadband infrastructure data and connection rates, digital equity and inclusion, affordability, cybersecurity;
- **Transportation** safety, nonmotorized, complete streets, multimodal, electric vehicles, emerging technologies;
- Environment green infrastructure, climate resiliency and flooding, infrastructure coordination, funding opportunities;
- Parks and Recreation needs analysis, planning for local and regional trail connections;
- Data and Mapping Services customized maps, data analysis for grants and plan updates;
- Video Services highlight communities solving problems and implementing plans, cultural and natural assets throughout Southeast Michigan; and
- Munetrix enhanced access to community fiscal data.

SEMCOG Funding Opportunities

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

(\$10 million per year)

TAP is a competitive grant program that funds projects in several transportation emphasis areas, such as:

- · Bicycle and pedestrian safety;
- Streetscapes and complete streets:
- Trails and pathways; and
- Environmental mitigation and stormwater management.

Planning Assistance Program

(\$500,000 per year)

SEMCOG's Planning Assistance Program provides direct funding for local planning projects that move regional plans and priorities forward and address priorities such as:

- · Corridor safety;
- · Trails and greenways;
- · Broadband:
- Stormwater management;
- · Transportation equity;
- · Complete streets; and
- Electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure planning.

Targeted Initiatives

Available funding varies year-to-year






Data and Maps

- · Timely, community-specific data and information;
- · Cutting-edge mapping;
- · Regional and local demographics; and
- · Economic development analysis.

SEMCOG maintains the following data and mapping tools to support effective planning:



Community Profiles

Current and forecasted data for populations, households, jobs, transportation, and environment/ land use data at the regional, county, and community levels. Customized profiles can be created by grouping communities together to view school districts or legislative districts.



Interactive mapping

Customize your viewing and downloading of equity emphasis areas, census and forecast data, traffic volumes, economic trends, broadband availability and usage, nonresidential/residential development projects, pavement and bridge conditions, tree canopy, and aerial imagery.



Aerial Imagery and Land Cover

Free or discounted access to spring 2023 highresolution aerial imagery, which is helpful for transportation projects, public works assessments, public safety, property assessment, environmental planning, and more.



Open Data Portal and GIS (Geographic Information Systems) Users Group

Easily download and share data and mapping information to support regional planning and modeling.

Transportation safety education throughout Southeast Michigan. WBDS provides resources to communicate everyone's responsibility to make safety our top priority on our streets, especially for people who walk, bike, and roll.

One Water

Focus is on the responsibility of preserving and upholding the quality of Southeast Michigan's interrelated drinking water, stormwater, and wastewater systems.

Shop Local

Promotes local opportunities to support and strengthen the regional economy. Shop Local videos feature unique local shopping, dining, and cultural experiences throughout Southeast Michigan, at no cost to members.

ParkFinder

- SEMCOG Legislative Policy Platform recommendations are developed based on data and in balance with the needs of all people who live in Southeast Michigan. The platform, adopted on a biannual basis in sync with legislative sessions, reflects the consensus of the region's local government leaders.
- **Legislative district maps** an up-to-date resource with easy-to-find contact information for each of Southeast Michigan's State and federal legislators.
- Advocacy engagement with State and federal legislators/officials, advocating for funding and policy positions representing the region.
- **Regulatory** representing the interests of local governments to State committees and rule-making bodies.


