Roadside pick up. Available in Putnam Township and the Village of Pinckney only. Filled bags should be left at the side of the road for pick up by our contractor on Mon., April 29. Items that are too large to fit in the bags should be left next the bags. Bags should be clearly visible from the road; please only use the bright yellow bags we provide in the clean up kits.

Teams may collect bottles or cans and return for deposit money, using their own, or a yellow bag that we supply.

Junk removal. Putnam Township, Village of Pinckney and Unadilla Township residents are welcome. *Prohibited items:*

Asbestos Beverage containers with a deposit Electronics Fluorescent lightbulbs and tubes

Hazardous waste Lead acid batteries

Medical waste Oil (cooking, motor, etc.)

Radioactive waste Septage/Sewage

Whole motor vehicle tires Yard clippings
