#### **New Water & Sewer Rates**

In September 2022, the WoodHill Group Accounting firm conducted a comprehensive review of the village's water and sewer rate structure to ensure that there are sufficient funds for the proper operation of the water and sewer systems in a financially stable condition as well as provide the funds necessary for a capital improvement program that will require significant investments in both the water and sewer systems over the next few years.

## Three Cost Components are used for the rate structure

- Capacity: The fixed costs to operate the system
  - \* operations & maintenance, administration, contractors, fixed overhead
  - Costs are allocated across all users based on their proportion of the total system
- Commodity: Variable charge based on individual usage X a usage rate
- Debt Service: A specific fixed charged based on the customer's proportion of outstanding debt obligations, including principal and interest.

Based on the forecast of annual costs and charges, beginning July 1<sup>st</sup> the water & sewer rates will be as follows:

Commodity Charge - Flat Rate Sewer Multi- Family		
(formerly SEWER10)	-	\$348.50

A "Meter Equivalent Unit" (MEU) of 1 is assumed for all residential users with a meter size up to 1".

## **PROPERTY TAXES**

#### NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Beginning the first part of August, S. Howell St. from M-36 south to Village limits will have temporary lane closures for a duration of three to five days. This project will consist of a cape seal being performed on the road surface that will strengthen and extend the life of the road by approximately seven to ten years. A cape seal is a form of re-surface in which a tacking substance is sprayed on the road, followed by a ¼ inch chip stone layer, then by an asphalt slurry with a fine stone overlay. Signs will be placed in open visible areas on both ends of S. Howell St. approximately one week before project is to begin, so plan accordingly and be prepared for travel delays during this time.

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## Free Gun Locks Still Available

In order to help protect families, in particular those with children, from tragedies of gun violence and unintentional firearms injuries, Michigan law requires secure storage of firearms. PA 17 of 2023 requires individuals to keep unattended weapons unloaded and locked with a locking device or stored in a locked box or container if it is reasonably known that a minor is likely to be present on the premises. Pinckney PD has gun locks available at no cost to residents. Stop by during regular business hours.

# **Driveways**

New or resurfacing a driveway: Chapter 92 of the Village Code requires that any work to construct a driveway that will be accomplished within the right-of-way of any road under the jurisdiction of the Village of Pinckney requires a permit. A plot plan shall be attached to the application.

All driveways must be constructed in accordance with the Village Technical Standards. All pre-existing driveways that are to be resurfaced or paved shall comply with this section. Right-of-way applications can be found:

Sealcoat: The use of sealers on asphalt driveways is a common practice. However, scientific studies on the use of driveway sealers have demonstrated a relationship between the use of coal tar-based sealers and certain health and environmental concerns, including increased cancer risk to humans and impaired water quality in streams. A waiver of land use permit is required to be obtained (no fee) so that we can ensure proper application. Applications can also be found on the website:

Per Village Ordinance 91.01, no burning in the Village is allowed except for some certain exceptions. A recreational fire is one of those exceptions. Keep in mind that a recreational fire has a total fuel area of three feet or less in diameter and two feet or less in height and is within a fireproof ring or pit and the fire is used for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking or similar purposes. Do not burn brush, leaves, large branches or trees.

Burn Ordinance

As a reminder, homeowners are responsible for maintenance of grass, trees and shrubs, not only on your property, but also within the road right-of-way. That includes the trimming of branches that may grow or hang over the sidewalk or roadway. Grass must be kept under nine (9) inches.

Weekly trash pick-up is provided on Wednesdays by Granger Services. There is an eight-bag limit per service day, with a 30 lb weight limit per bag **not larger** than a 30-gallon bag. If you are using the 96-gallon cart service, you're allowed an additional three (3) bags on the outside of the cart. Any bags in addition to the three (3) extra bags **will not be collected** unless the resident has scheduled and prepaid with Granger at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of service.

One residential bulk item per household per week will be collected at no charge. Freon should NOT be left in any appliance & refrigerators/freezers must have the doors removed for safety. A \$50 fee will be charged to your account if freon is left in an appliance placed out for disposal. Call Granger to make arrangements for any bulk item: 1-888-947-2643.
