Cart Placement Success Tips



To ensure Curby carts are placed correctly, residents can follow these tips:

1. Place cart with handle away from the street.
2. Place within 3 feet of the street.
3. Keep 3 feet between carts and away from other objects.

Safe Fireworks Disposal



Help keep your communities safe by spreading the word about safe fireworks disposal.

- Fireworks and firework remnants should be disposed of as trash and kept out of recycling collection.
- Placing used fireworks in a bucket of water overnight before disposal will help ensure they are extinguished.
- Once soaked overnight, they should be placed in a garbage bag for disposal.
- Unused fireworks should be soaked in water until completely saturated. This could take as long as overnight, depending on the size of the fireworks.
- The completely soaked fireworks should be double wrapped in plastic wrap or two plastic bags so they do not dry out before being placed inside a trash bag.
